WHAT IS ISKCON?

The Hare Krishna Movement is the popular name for the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON). It is a worldwide community of devotees practicing bhakti-yoga, the eternal science of loving service to Lord Krishna (God).

The tradition of this movement is rooted in the ancient Vedic texts. especially the famous classic Bhagavad-gita, which contains the essential teachings of Lord Krishna that were spoken 5000 years ago.

WHO STARTED ISKCON?

The Society was founded in 1966 by His Divine Grace A. C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada (1896-1977), a pure devotee of God representing an unbroken chain of spiritual masters originating with Lord Krishna Himself. It was 1965 when Srila Prabhupada traveled alone from India to New York City to establish the culture of Krishna Consciousness in the Western world. In the course of his lifetime, he single-handedly began a world-wide confederation of over one hundred temples, farm communities and institutes.

FEEDING THE NEEDY >

Our food distribution program, Food For Life (FFL), gives out freshly-made hot vegetarian food weekly, at various locations in London, and daily at our centre. Our FFL branch is part of the Food For Life Global charity that combats hunger and crisis relief by serving 2 million free plates a day, internationally. (www.ffl.org)

ADULT EDUCATION COURSES >

We hold regular adult educational courses at our ISKCON-London centre, with an emphasis on moral education and vocational training on specific topics such as healthy-lifestyles, cooking, and music.We also have free daily discourses and taster sessions on philosophy, meditation and yoga open to all.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT >

Our centre holds annually 10 large public festivals with more than 1,200 participants, and more than 30,000 during our yearly summer Ratha-Yatra procession, at Trafalgar Square. We have daily street processions, where we give away books and invite the public to our centre through lively music and dance. We also annually distribute more than 60,000 books to the public. We are a lifeline for many families, elderly and students in London, to find a quiet place to spend time, connect with others and have a warm meal.

VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITIES >

Volunteers are an integral part of ISKCON-London with more than 300 such volunteers who yearly contribute to the organisation of any events, festivals, courses, cultural showcases and all of our outreach work. Volunteering, or seva in Sanskrit, is fundamental to one's emotional and spiritual health, as well as gives a sense of ownership to one's community. Our volunteers are given full access to hands-on work and leadership roles, and are taken care of as individuals in a lively and dynamic environment.

Our aim is to live and educate others on a holistic lifestyle that includes a vegetarian diet, ahimsa (non-violent) consumerism, meditation and bhakti-yoga. Our centre's owned-and-operated Govinda's Restaurant, is a flagship pure vegetarian restaurant in London since 1979.

ISKCON's heritage is rooted in the ancient Vedic culture of India that is a plethora of wisdom in the arts, music, dance, cuisine and literature.
